## **INTRODUCTION**

Terrorism, is it the scourge of our time? Are you fearful of being involved in a terrorist attack? Quite frankly it almost depends on where in the world you live. It is often because a safe place today is a terror target tomorrow. With the desire on the part of the terrorists to obtain weapons of mass destruction, i.e. chemical, biological, or even a dirty bomb or nuclear bomb, the potential for a massive destructive attack increases exponentially.

This course looks at the recent history of terrorism from the early twentieth century to today

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course employs a correctional officers framework for the analysis and evaluation of terrorist groups and individuals, terrorist origins, goals, dynamics, ideologies and counter terrorism. The course will include a discussion of the task of defining terrorism, an exploration of the history and causes of terrorism (both internationally and domestically), the structure and organization of terrorist groups, an overview of the methods and weapons of terrorists, and public policies, strategies and approaches for combating and preventing terrorism.

- Formulate a working definition of terrorism and assess the problems associated with the various social, political and cultural contexts of that meaning;
- Construct a framework from a correctional perspective to analyze terrorism and terrorists;
- List and summarize the historical and theoretical perspectives that have been a major influence on our understanding of violence and modern day terrorism;
- Analyze and evaluate the patterns and trends of terrorism, including methods, modes of attack, tactics, and strategies;
- Apply theories and policies of counter terrorism, including scholarly

controversies relating to the media and civilians; and,

- Identify key people who have influenced our understanding of the characteristics, causes, and controls of terrorism.

## **THE COURSE PREREQUISITES:**

1. Senior Correctional/Prison Officer (Middle Level Rank or Higher)
2. Proficient In English.
3. Applicant should have 10 years or more in relevant working experience.
